The Annual Boston Jewish Film Festival

Every November, we present an 11 + day Festival of the world's best contemporary films on Jewish themes. The largest annual Jewish cultural event in Boston and one of the most highly regarded film festivals in the New England area, The Boston Jewish Film Festival includes more than 50 film screenings, 20 or more visiting artists, and scores of local writers, performers, and musicians. Screenings take place at multiple venues throughout the city and in surrounding communities, including the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston, the Coolidge Corner Theatre, the West Newton Cinema, and venues North, South, and West of Boston.

Friends Pass

A Friends Pass, valued at \$200 each, entitles the holder to guaranteed, free admission to all films in the annual eleven-day November Boston Jewish Film Festival, including Opening Night, Closing Night, and all other special film events. Friends Pass holders may arrive up to 15 minutes before showtime (advanced reservations required for special events) and be guaranteed a seat. The Friends Pass line ensures that Pass holders receive first admission into the theatre.

Work-in-Progress Screening and Reception

The Work-in-Progress event is a special opportunity to see behind the scenes of the filmmaking process. We invite a filmmaker to screen footage from a new work-in-progress and to take your questions. A complimentary buffet reception rounds out the evening.

Annual Gala Event

Each fall, just before the annual Festival, we celebrate with a gala event, generally including dinner and a screening of a new feature film. This is a chance to see a special new film, with a filmmaker, actor, or producer present; meet other supporters and visiting artists; and get ready for the upcoming Festival!

Encore Series

Each spring, we bring back several Festival Favorite films for an Encore series at the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston. Often, we include a new film in the program as well. This is a great opportunity to introduce friends to the Festival, or to see a film you might have missed yourself.
